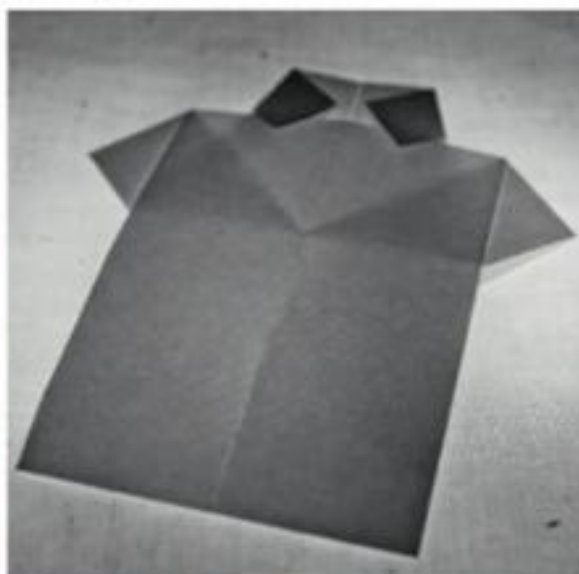


# White shirt, white heat competition winners
